Eliminate, by 2030, all forms of gender-based violence, including child and forced marriages, by addressing social and cultural norms that propagate the practice while providing support to women and girls who have been affected

Summary of Key GoK Achievement

Objective 1: To increase access to quality and comprehensive response and support services across sectors

- 680 GBV prevention service providers trained
- 52 non-state shelters, recovery and rescue centres identified in 18 counties
- establishment and operationalization of GBV Response Centres in Makueni, Kwale, Bungoma and Kiambu to offer quality services at County referral hospitals
- Capacity building of the Gender Sector Working Group and the County Gender Technical Working Groups
- Guidelines and training materials on affirmative action against GBV developed

Objective 2: To improve coordination and sustainability for effective programming for GBV prevention and response

- 15 multi-stakeholder Gender Technical Working Groups GBV trained on interventions at County levels
- upgrading of GBV Service Provider's Directory in 18 counties
- 140 stakeholders (community, medical practitioners, law enforcement and legal linkages) sensitization on evidence management
- 5 counties developed their county specific gender policies (cumulative: 12 policies developed since 2019)

Objective 3: To improve enforcement of laws and policies towards prevention of GBV

- 700 public and private sector actors in targeted counties sensitized on GBV prevention
- 180 County Court Users' Committees sensitized on enforcement and enhancement of delivery of justice for GBV survivors
- sensitization on handling GBV victims, perpetrators and physical evidence

Objective 4: To eliminate social cultural norms that affect women and girls

- 2,350 men, boys and morans identified as allies, advocates, role models, champions and change agents and sensitized on GBV prevention
- communities and religious leaders engaged in dialogues to end harmful practices and social norms
- Bodaboda operators sensitized and enrolled as champions and ambassadors for prevention of child marriage and to support GBV prevention campaigns in 21 counties
- Media campaigns against GBV, FGM, adolescent pregnancy and child marriage
- Support advocacy forums on elimination of harmful socio-cultural norms and enhance enforcement, prevention, protection and child care services



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- focused training on legal and policy frameworks

Contributions of Development Partners, CSOs, Private Sector and Other Actors

- support intergovernmental framework on gender activities at national and county level
- enhanced rescue services and provision of safe homes
- support integration of GBV into ASRHR services at facility level
- 869 GBV survivors supported with court expert witnesses
- Establishment of one GBV TWG and support 12 existing ones in Mandera, Garissa, HomaBay, Kajiado, Samburu, West Pokot, Kilifi, Kwale and Nairobi
- 2TWGs established in Kwale
- Conducted advocacy sessions on empowerment of girls and young women
- Nairobi Country Gender Sector Working Group supported to formulate a policy on elimination of teen pregnancy and other forms of GBV
- sensitization of law and justice enforcement units on GBV
- Supported rescued girls to rejoin school
- 24 service providers trained on GBV
- support SDFG in policies and frameworks development, development of training materials and printing of IEC materials
- Implementation of Kenya-Finland Bilateral Programme on strengthening prevention and response of GBV and FGM in Kilifi, Bungoma and Samburu
