Eliminate preventable maternal and newborn morbidity and mortality, mother to child transmission of HIV, and severe morbidity such as fistulas by 2030

Summary of Key GoK Achievements

- 2115 health facilities equipped with assorted MNH equipment to provide EmONC
- Capacity building of in-service health care workers in providing HIV, FP, EmONC, post abortion care and QOC standards: 500 trained in EmONC; 3500+ CHAs; 750 HCPs trained on obstetric fistula since 2019; 3650 staff and 150 service providers trained on PMTCT in all counties
- Reproductive Health Policy finalized, launched and disseminated nationally. Health sector response action plan also developed and launched.
- Domestic funding for critical commodities: Budgetary allocation for Family planning commodities increased by over 10 per cent of the previous year
- Advocacy for triple elimination of mother-to-child transmission (eMTCT) of HIV, Syphilis and Hepatitis
- 500 trained midwives engaged into service
- counties assisted to adopt the National Referral Protocols for Maternal and Child Services
- Strengthened data management and use for decision making for FP, HIV and maternal health; routine reporting and real-time data relay; digitization of reporting and connectivity through telemedicine
- budget allocation for FP commodities increased by 10 per cent both at county and national level
- IEC and training materials used to enhance capacity of mentor mothers, CHWs, CHEWs, for provision of FP, HIV and maternal, newborn information and interventions
- FP pharmacovigilance established and implemented in all counties
- Integrate obstetric fistula prevention and management into the Linda Mama and UHC package of care
- Develop and roll out SRH, HIV, TB, GBV prevention and control frameworks /guidelines including eMTCT in all counties
- integration and accountability of SRH/HIV/STI multi-sectoral coordination strengthened at national and county level
- Increased decentralization of HIV testing, linkage care and treatment delivery points

• Expansion of Mentor mother program resulted in:





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- Sustained uptake of ANC and skilled deliveries (skilled deliveries rose from 60% to 89% between 2014 and 2022); increase in mCPR from 53% in 2014 to 63% in 2022
- Expanded contraceptive method mix
- Finalization and dissemination of Maternal Newborn Health Standards for Improving Quality of Care and MNH Quality of Care Assessment Tools in line with WHO Standards for Improving Quality of Maternal and Newborn Care in health facilities (2016)
- Mainstreamed maternal and reproductive health responsiveness in emergencies through development and dissemination of RH guidelines during COVID-19 emergency
- Demand creation and advocacy to promote the uptake of PMTCT through the engagement of male opinion leaders and male champions at community level in high prevalence counties.

Summary of Key Contributions of Development Partners, CSOs and Private Sector

- Demand creation for quality SRH services:
- 2,864 Kenya National Youth Service (NYS) from Nairobi, Kisumu and Gilgil trained on Sexual Reproductive Health Empowerment Academic and Career Mentoring leadership and Governance (SEAL)
- Community dialogues and outreaches on HIV/AIDS treatment and support, SGBV and life skills in Kilifi, Migori, Kwale
- 1340 community leaders in Kilifi identified as FP champions and tasked with public sensitization on FP and 1070 community owned resource persons recruited, trained and equipped as CBDs
- Roll out of Binti wa Kisasa toll-free call platform
- Improving quality of care for maternal and neonatal health:
- Review of Basic Counselling Services for postpartum FP
- Dissemination of FP dashboard in Bungoma, W/Pokot, Nandi and Mombasa
