Summary of Key Achievements by GoK

Objective 1: Undertake institutional capacity assessment of relevant government institutions to provide quality, timely and reliable population data:

- Kenya Strategy for Development of Statistics (KSDS) launched. A tool to inform baseline on mandate, roles and functions of NSS
- Kenya Statistical Quality Assessment Framework (KeSQAF) launched. A guide for assessing and monitoring the quality of statistics in NSS

Objective 2: Undertake capacity building on data collection and management among the relevant government institution

- 30 government institutions capacity built through technical working committees
- 13 counties supported to develop County Statistical Abstracts (CSAs)
- Kenya Ports Authority supported to develop its Statistical Strategic Plan
- KNBS technical staff trained on construction of poverty indices

Objective 3: Undertake promotion of data use for decision making

- Launched and disseminated 25 reports (2019 KPHC analytical reports - 12, Quarterly labour force reports - 2, Census of commercial firms - 1, Fin access - 1, Women & Men factsheet - 2, 2022 Economic survey - 3, Facts and figures - 3, and 2021 statistical abstract - 1)
- Launched Kenya Statistical Quality Assurance Framework (KeSQAF)
- Held 8 dialogue meetings on older persons in Kwale county
- Trained 8 County Population Coordinators on data analysis and 23 staff and research assistants in preparation of 2022 study on status of family in Kenya: Case study of Muranga & Kwale counties
- Formed 6 Sectoral Technical Committees to review and validate analyzed figures/outputs on Health, Gender, Disability, Agriculture, Education and Vital Statistics for production of the annual Economic Survey report
- Celebrated African Statistics Day (ASD) of 2021 and the World Population Day (WPD) of 2021
- Support development of 11 County Statistical Abstracts (CSA) (Makueni, Laikipia, Kericho, Nyandarua, Nakuru, Uasin Gishu, Garissa, Kajiado, Nandi, Kitui and Nairobi City) for both 2021 and 2022 but at different stages of implementation

- Public access to datasets and reports availed on KeNADA, KenInfo, IMIS, Kenya Open data, Data Visualization and Kenya Data Portal

- Implementation of the 2022 Kenya Demographic and Health Survey (KDHS)
- Implementation of the 2022 Kenya Family Study (KFS) in Murang'a and Kwale counties
